# OUR CLASSROOM NEWS



Look what we've been learning this week...

## EYFS



We have been using linking cubes in maths to enhance our knowledge on number bonds. Some children have created a lovely cross out of the cubes telling us how many we need to add or take away to make it bigger or smaller.

In Year One this week, Maisie brought in Ten Little Rubber Ducks by Ten Little Rubber Ducks by Eric Carle, which sparked great interest in the class. The children learned that the story is based on a real event from 2003, when thousands of rubber ducks were lost at sea from a shipping container. Inspired by this, Year One measured 40 feet outside and explored a globe to see where the ducks might have travelled. Mrs Wright has also added 10 rubber ducks to the maths area to support counting and number learning.

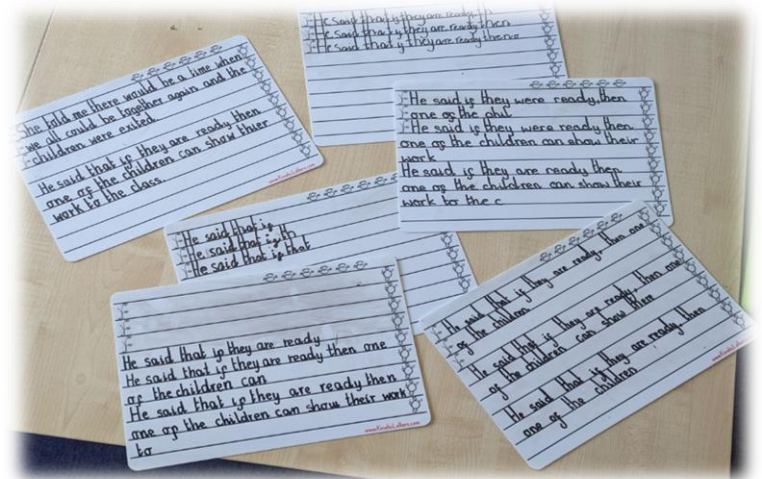
# YEAR 4
