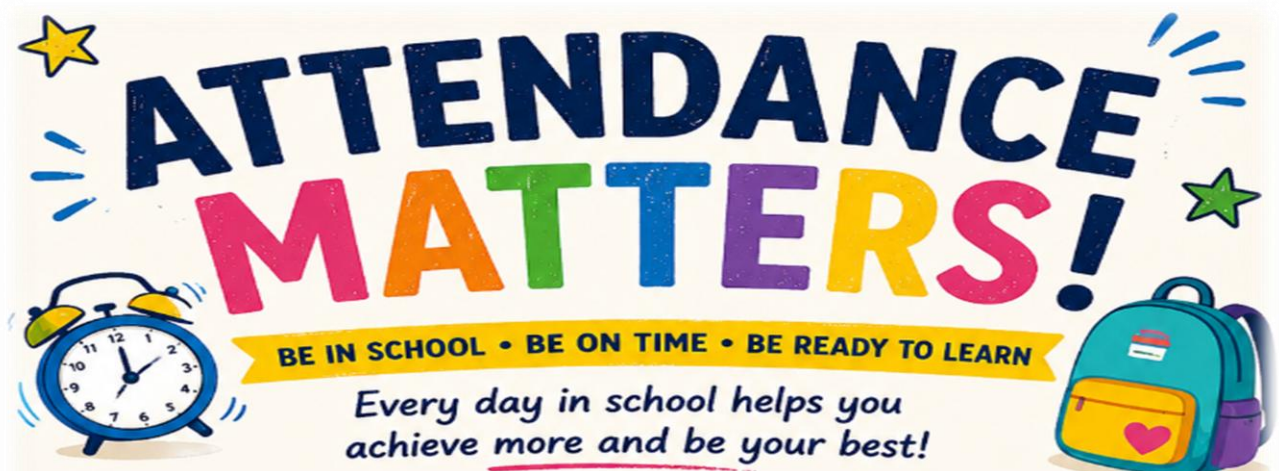

Look what we've been learning this week...

EYFS

As part of our Geography learning, the children explored the differences between a city and the countryside. They looked carefully at the features of each environment, discussing what they might see, hear and find in both places. The children enjoyed sharing their ideas and comparing busy city life with the peaceful countryside before deciding where they would most like to live. It was wonderful to hear their thoughtful reasons and learn more about the world around them.



YEAR 1

Year One met the multi-talented Dr. Martin, who shared his work across medicine, engineering, and design. He explained the metals used in coins, imaging technology for detecting skin cancer, and how printing uses just four colours and millions of dots. He also showcased the medical uses of 3D printing, including jawbones and skull implants, as well as its role in Formula One, where he helped create durable car parts, and in producing film props.



YEAR 2

Year 2 have been looking at the story 'The Building Boy' in their English lessons. The children used drama to act out objects and items coming to life. Some children chose to be dolls, teddies or even teapots!

We had an exciting visitor come and show and talk to all the children about 3D printing. The children were amazed what could be made from it.

Year 4 had some fun outdoor learning and played a game called 'Stations', where they had to go to each station and answer a question.
